I am going to Lake Forest Library.

Note to Caregivers

This is the front of my Library.



I visit the Library with my parent or grown-up and make sure to stay with them.

This is the Foyer when I enter the Library.



Now that I am inside, I will talk quietly and not run or go fast.

Sometimes in the Foyer I will hear an alarm ring. It is loud, but I don't have to worry. It just means someone forgot to check out a book.

These are stairs that go to the Children's Library.



I can take the stairs down to the Children's Library. I hold on to the railing when I use the stairs.

Or I can take the Elevator. The Elevator is at the back of the building.

This is the Children's Foyer.



I can use a Restroom here.

I can check the Stuffie sign. If I find the Stuffie and tell the Librarians where the Stuffie is, I earn a sticker.

Sometimes I will hear an alarm ring. It is loud, but I don't have to worry. It just means someone forgot to check out a book.

This is a Restroom.



The door is heavy. I need to turn on the light switch. I need to lock the door behind me. The toilet flushes on its own and it is loud. When I am finished, I wash my hands.

In the Children's Library ...



I can visit the Design Center. I can pick up crafts to take home and make.

I can visit the Service Desk. I can say or wave hello to a friendly Librarian there. I can ask them for help.

I can ask a Librarian for a Social Story Kit with noise-canceling headphones and other items to use while I visit the Library.

I can find Books, DVDs, and Launchpads.

In the Children's Library ...



I can play at the Puppet Stage with puppets, puzzles, and toys.

I can go to storytimes and other fun events here.

This is the Fiction Section.



I can find Fiction Books, Graphic Novels, and Audiobooks here.

I can use the tables and chairs.

This is the Nonfiction Section.



I can find Nonfiction Books, Exploration Kits, and Accessibility items here.

I can use the Elevator with my grown-up.

I can use a computer.

These are the stairs to the Teen Space and DVDs Section.

I can find Teen items, Video Games, and DVDs here.

I am ready to go home.



I use my library card to borrow items. A Librarian at the Service Desk can check them out for me. Or I can use a Self-Checkout Kiosk.

I am ready to go home.



Sometimes when I leave the Children's Library I will hear an alarm ring. It is loud, but I don't have to worry. It just means someone forgot to check a book out.

I can come back to the Library again!

This is a Return Slot.



I can return my items here when I am done with them.

Or I can put my books in the Return Bin. The Return Bin is outside near the front entrance.

This is the Elevator at the back of the building.



To get to the Elevator, I go through many spaces with shelves and books.

I go through the Rotunda.

I go through the Fiction Room.

I go through the Fiction Annex.

To go down to the Children’s Library in the Basement, I press the “BSMT” button. The button has an arrow pointing to it.
