First, create a Memory Jar to hold treasured mementos: photos, trinkets, notes, anything and everything that is meaningful to your family. Second, reserve the Library's Media Lab to record a story, an interview with a family member, a conversation with friends, a favorite song or greeting. If you've heard the popular *StoryCorps* spots on NPR, this is your chance to make your own audio keepsake. The Library will save the audio keepsake on a USB drive to share with family this holiday season.
